

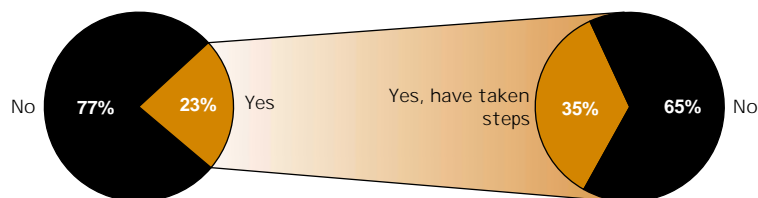

Have you made any preparations within the past week, since the recent code orange alert about the risk of a terrorist attack?

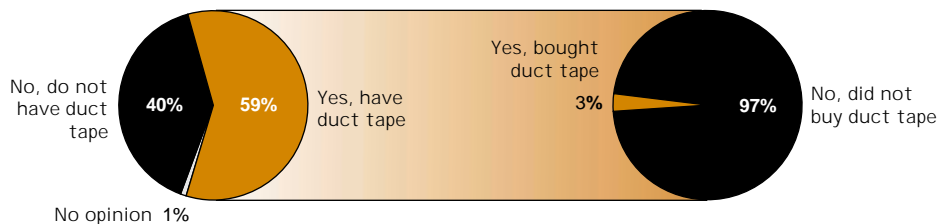

Did you go to the store and buy duct tape after the government raised the terrorist threat just over a week ago, or not?



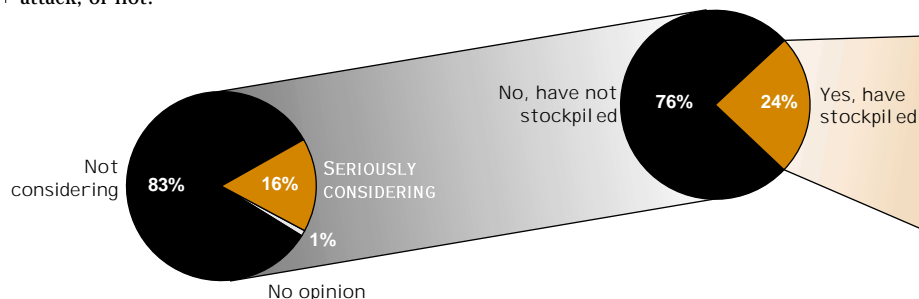

Do you happen to have stockpiled any items in your home to have on hand in case of a terrorist attack, or not?

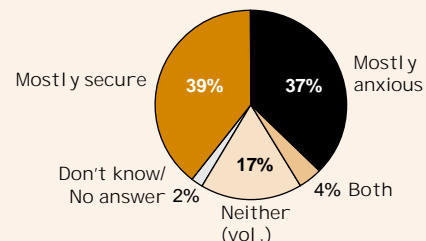

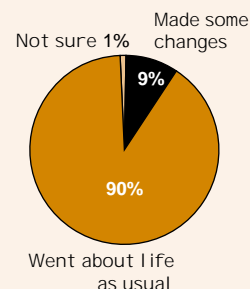
Have the warnings [the government has issued] made you feel mostly secure or mostly anxious?

After the terror alert level was increased last week, did you or members of your family go about day-to-day life as usual or did you make some changes in response to the alert?

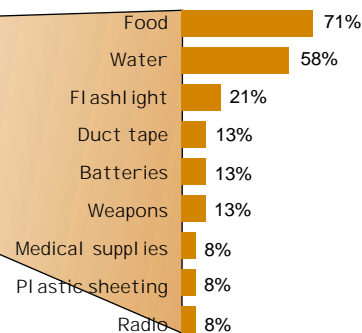
