
# RATING GEORGE BUSH




Question: Since he became President, has your opinion of George Bush improved a great deal, improved somewhat, gotten worse, or has it stayed the same?









Question: Do you approve or disapprove of the way (Ronald Reagan/ George Bush) is handling his job as President?




