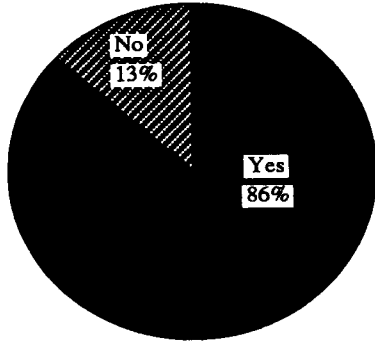

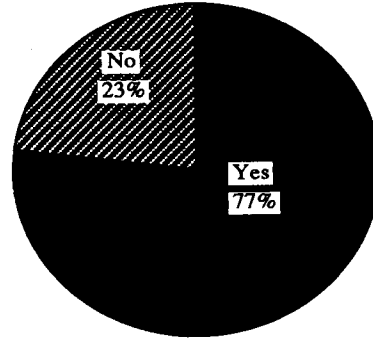
AMERICAN OPINION ON HEALTH ISSUES: A ROPER CENTER SAMPLING

Question: Are you personally covered by a health care plan, or not?



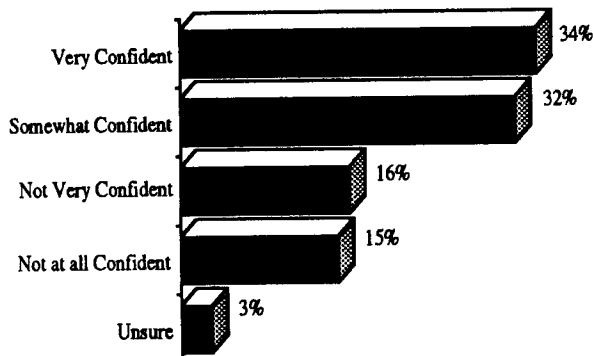

Question: Please tell me if you feel financially secure in the following areas:...Your health insurance coverage.



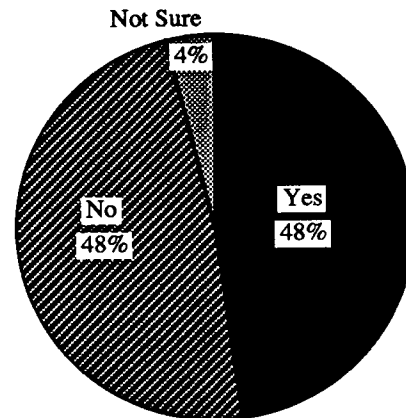

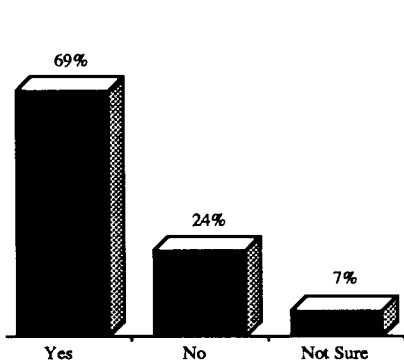


Question: Suppose you became critically ill. Taking into account whatever medical insurance you have and also your current finances, do you think you would be able to afford good medical care today, or not?

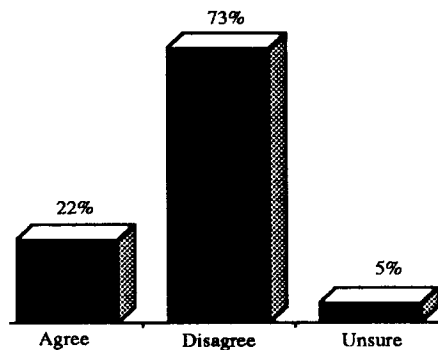
Costs are too high for value rendered

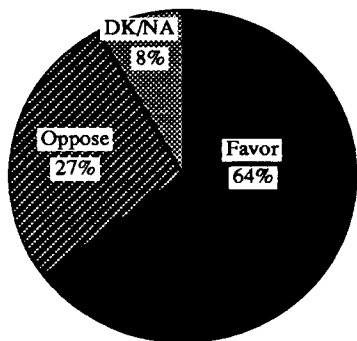
Question: (Agree/Disagree) All things considered, the high quality of health care in the United States justifies the high cost of health care.

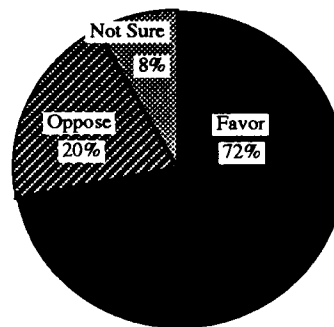
The general idea of national health insurance wins approval. Paying for it is another matter.

Question: If it meant an increase in your taxes, would you favor or oppose a comprehensive national health insurance plan for all Americans?



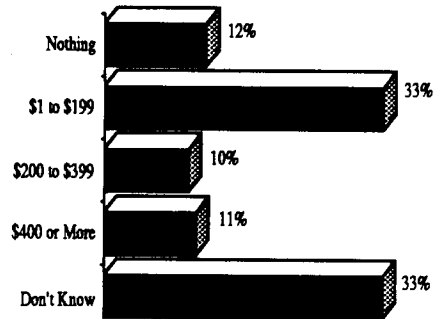

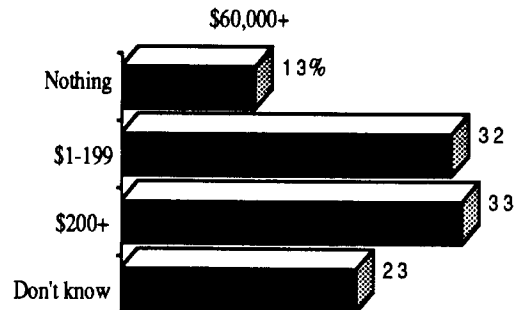
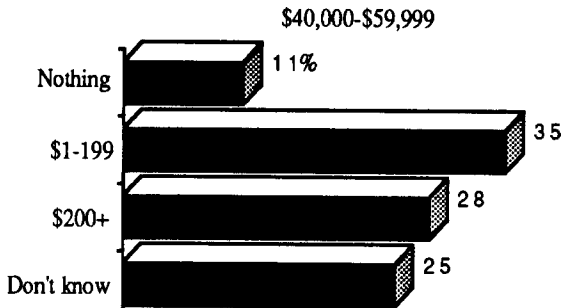
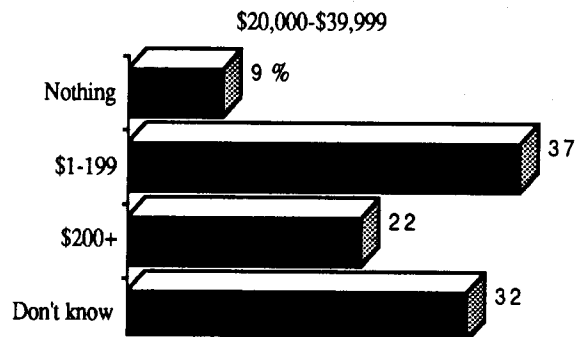
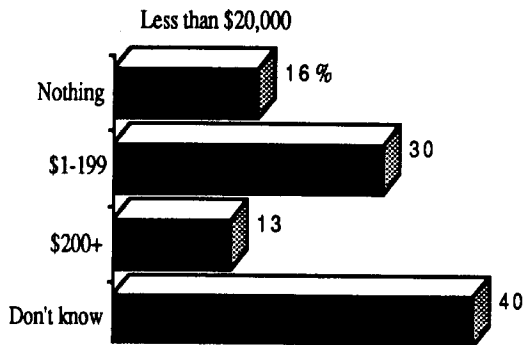
Question: About how much each year would you be willing to pay in additional taxes to support expanded health insurance coverage for all Americans?
