
## THE DELEGATES: 1968-88

In 1968, CBS News began a study of the convention delegates, providing a wealth of demographic and attitudinal data. Over the 20-year span, for example, Democrats tripled their percentage of women delegates. The attitudes of delegates differ from the population. Republican and Democratic delegates are often sharply polarized.
