


It May Not Be Enough, But **Americans Still Stand Out** In Their Level of **Voluntary Work**




How Much Volunteer Work?






Question: People practice their religion in different ways. Outside of attending religious services, do you pray several times a day, once a day, a few times a week, once a week or less, or never?














Question: Many of our nation's founders believed that America could not survive as a free and democratic nation without a religious foundation. Do you, yourself, believe this is true today?

Note that the World Values Survey was done by the World Values Study Group, part of the Inter-University Consortium for Political and Social Research. The samples consist of adults age 18 and over, in 45 countries. The in-person interviews were conducted by local survey organizations. Sample sizes: varied from country to country. Questions 4 and 5 are from a cross-national survey done by the Gallup Organization for Applied Research in the Apostalate, 1981; question 6 is from cross-national surveys done for the Times Mirror Company.
