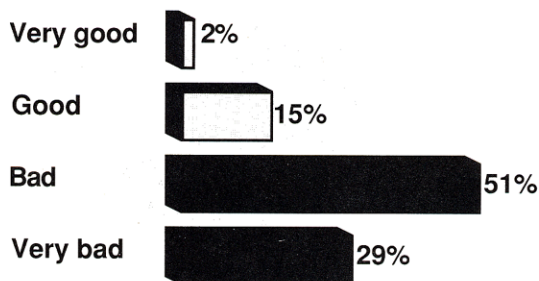


Economic Angst (Of Course)

Question: How would you rate the condition of the national economy? Would you say it is very good, good, bad or very bad?

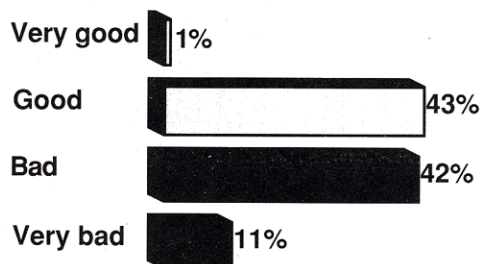
National Economy



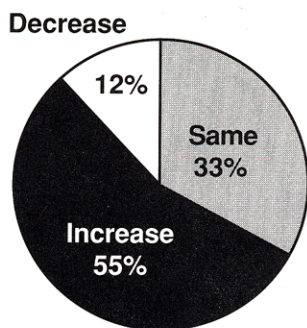

Own Situation

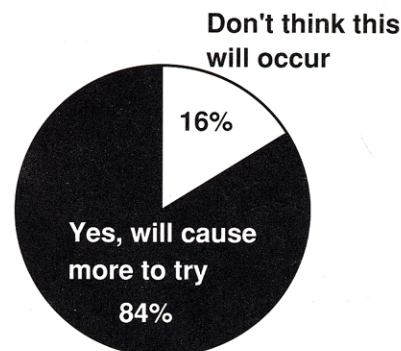


Question: Do you think unemployment in the coming months is going to increase, stay the same, or decrease?



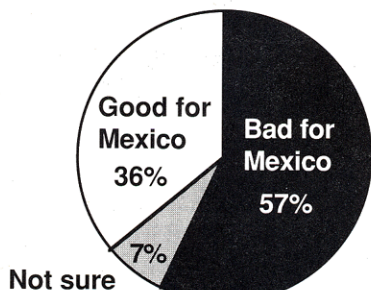

Question: Do you think the devaluation [of the peso] will cause more Mexicans to try to cross over into the United States illegally in order to get jobs, or don't you think this will occur?



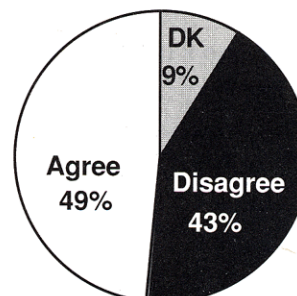

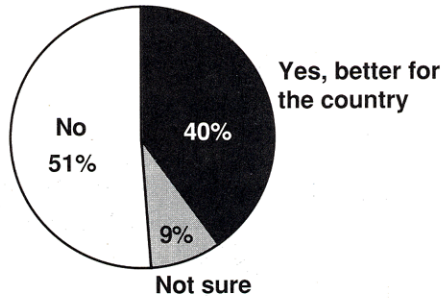
Question: Do you agree or disagree with the Mexican government accepting financial assistance from the US?



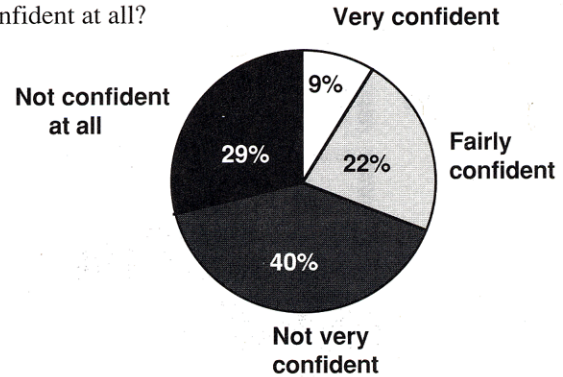

Question: Do you think it would be better for the country if a different political party were in power right now, or don't you feel that way?



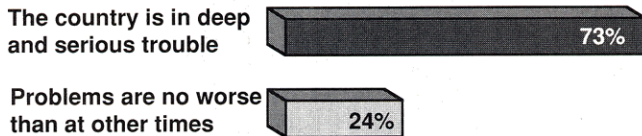
Question: How confident are you in the ability of the Mexican government to handle the nation's economic problems? Are you very confident, fairly confident, not very confident, or not confident at all?



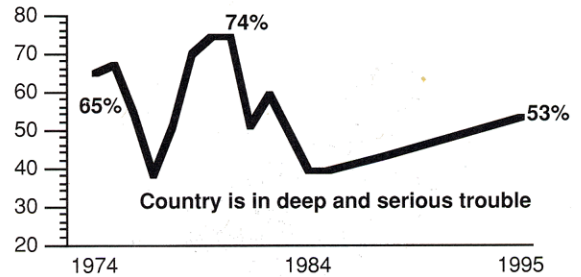
Perspective Helps: The US Has Been "Down" Politically Too

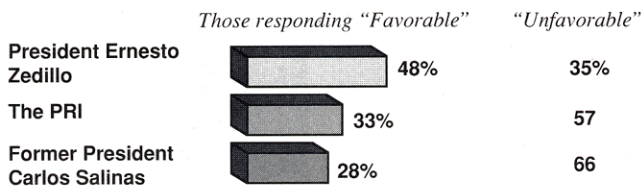

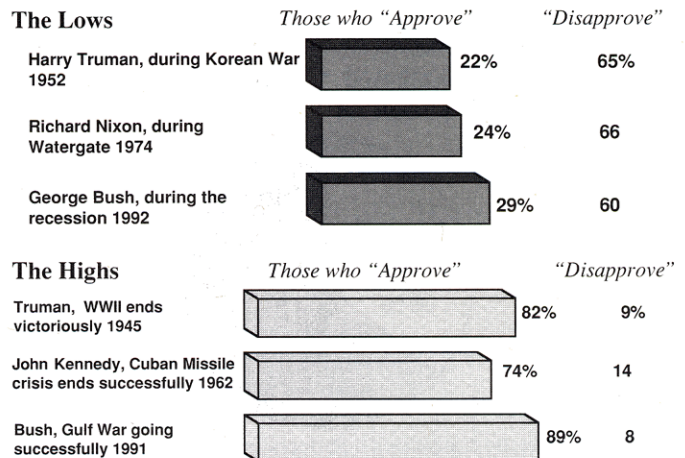

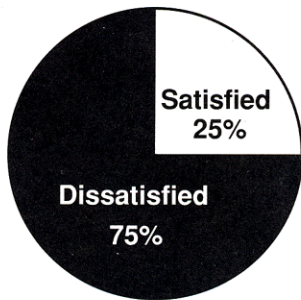
Question: Do you approve or disapprove of the way... is handling his job as president?



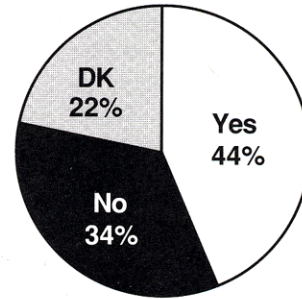

Zedillo is Looking Remarkably Strong

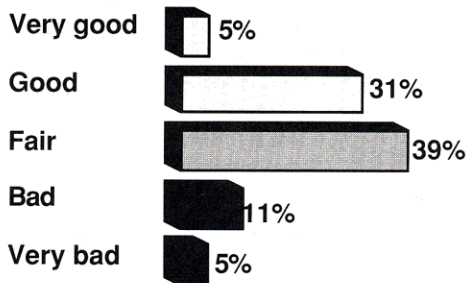
Question: Overall, would you say you're satisfied or dissatisfied with how democracy is working in Mexico?



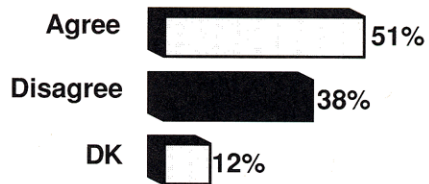
Question: In your opinion, has President Zedillo shown or not the capacity to rule the country?



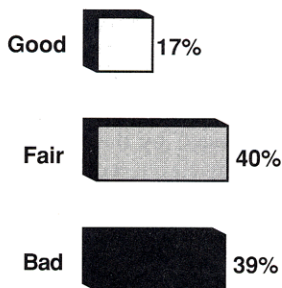
Question: How would you rate President Zedillo's job?



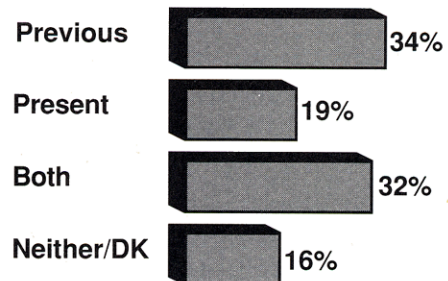
Question: Overall, do you agree or disagree with the actions taken by President Zedillo to address the economic problems of the country?
