## The 1995 French Presidential Vote What Happened?

Already holding a (large) majority in the National Assembly won in the April 1993 election, the right-of-center coalition regained the presidency with the election of Jacques Chirac. Vallery Giscard d'Estaing's victory in 1974 was the last time before this year's May 7 run-off that the Right coalition had managed a victory.

## What the Surveys Showed

Polling organizations have had a hard time estimating the vote in recent elections in many different democracies, including the United States and the United Kingdom. France joins this roster. The polls underestimated support for Socialist nominee Lionel Jospin in the first round of the French vote held April 23. They overestimated support for Chirac—who had been shown the leader in every pre-election poll taken after March 1.


