


We See Traces of Depression-Bred Resentment, as in a Majority's Saying the People Would Benefit From the **Disappearance of Great Fortunes**

Question: If the great fortunes such as Rockefeller's and Morgan's are going to disappear, will the people as a whole benefit or will it mean less prosperity for all?






Question: The president often has stated that one-third of the population of the US has less than a minimum of the necessities for a decent life. Do you agree with him?

Question: Do you think that the federal government should follow a policy of taking money from those who have much and giving money to those who have little?





Note: Fortune described the sample this way: "Primary attention is given to male farmers with responsibility for the land they cultivate—owners, tenants and sharecroppers. Smaller samples of opinion were taken among farm wives and hired hands, but the samples were large enough to reveal a remarkable cohesion among all the people who inhabit farms."


The Public's Support for the New Deal Was Strong Throughout the Latter Half of the Thirties—But It Reflected Surprisingly Conservative Impulses


