


The Record of Elections Past

Popular Vote for US Representatives


1932-1996

The 1994 vote was only the third since 1930, and the first since 1946, in which Republicans won a majority of the popular vote for Congress.




Party Shares of Seats in the US House of Representatives, 1932-1996




Party Control of the Governorships, 1952-1996
